Preliminary round

Sunday – Tuesday Teams are divided into groups of 4–5, each plays against all others.

Final Rounds - Knockout System

Wednesday – Friday

The two best teams in each group advance to the A-finals, the others to the B-finals.

Finals

7-a-side and 9-a-side teams: Friday, July 31st 11-a-side teams: Saturday, 1st August

Prices

- Plaque for group winners (one per team)
- Trophy and medals for places 1–3 in the A-finals
- Trophy for 1st and 2nd place in the B-finals
- Award for the best player in the A-finals
